# WHAT WOULD YOU NEED TO BE MORE POWERFUL?

## I don't know

The population should start thinking and defending their rights.

People should be treated as human beings. Rights and freedoms must be preserved even in times of war.

We need more people to take advantage of the opportunities available to them to exercise power: not only to go to elections, but also to participate in budget discussions, to fight, to join NGOs and open them

It is probably necessary to somehow prohibit the expression of will to the residents of the Soviet Union (to prohibit participation in political processes for all those over 60), to overcome corruption - it is it that slows down and does not allow democratic processes

I am satisfied with the current democratic situation in the country. The last presidential election was a vivid example of democracy.
